



OCCUPATIONAL RISK PREVENTION POLICY (O.R.P.)

The management of FUENTEPARK, aware that the activity it carries out may cause damage to the health and safety of workers and third parties who may remain on the premises, has determined the development of an occupational risk prevention management system integrated into its activity, in accordance with the following principles:

Preventive activity, will be aimed at avoiding risks and assessing those that could not be eliminated.

The determination of preventive measures, will be carried out trying to act on the origin of the risks and where appropriate, putting collective protection before individual protection and consider the additional risks that may involve and may only be adopted when the magnitude of these risks, is substantially lower than those intended to control and there are no safer alternatives.

The choice of equipment and methods of work and production shall be made with a view in particular to reducing monotonous and repetitive work and its effects on the health of workers.

Prevention planning shall aim at a coherent whole integrating technology, organisation of work, working conditions, social relations and the influence of environmental factors at work.

Only workers who have received sufficient information shall be allowed access to an area with a serious and specific risk.

Before a worker is assigned to a task, his professional safety and health capability to carry out the task must be considered.

In assessing the hazardousness of processes, the consequences of possible distractions or non-dangerous imprudence on the part of workers in carrying out such processes shall be considered.

Workers have the right to participate actively in matters relating to the prevention of risks at work, for which purpose the representative channels legally established in Chapter V of the Law on the Prevention of Occupational Risks shall be available.

To consider road safety as a company priority.





To this end, we are committed both to compliance with the applicable legislation, both to the prevention of damage and deterioration of health, and to the continuous improvement of occupational health and safety management.

These principles, which will be disseminated throughout the organisation, will serve as a guide for the determination of the objectives, which will be established annually, according to criteria of continuous improvement, to ensure that the policy of the entity is met, thanks to the effort and collaboration of all workers and managers and the support of the management team of the entity.
